Accession numbers can be in several formats, as long as there is one for each plant

The cultivar name should be written in normal text with inverted commas around it.

The genus and species should be in italic, with a capital letter for the genus, not for the species.

It is ok if you do not know the source of all your plants, as long as you have records for most of them

It doesn't matter if you don't know the date for every plant, as long as you have records for most of them

If your plant is produced from material from another of your accessions, it is easy to trace them if for example they turn out to be wrongly named

Remember that rare plants are often available free through the Plant Exchange.
